Advanced Computing – Week 3 Security issues on the internet

The security aspects of using the internet is important because we have control in what we are using on the net so as not to fall into the trap of viruses.

The internet also remains a powerful tools to gather information and learn things. The internet also enables us to communicate with friends through Skype to far way relatives. Because the Internet is so easily accessible to anyone, it can be a dangerous place. Know who you're dealing with or what you're getting into. Predators, cyber criminals, bullies, and corrupt businesses will try to take advantage of the unwary visitor.

Virus

A virus is a tiny program which replicates itself over the computer system. It has a mischievous intention to do harm to the computer system. In a virus, we have to parts:

- 1. Infector
- 2. Detonator

Viruses are malicious programs that spread throughout computer files without user knowledge. Most widespread virus infections spread through email message attachments that activate when opened. The vicious cycle of a virus perpetuates as infected emails are forwarded to multiple users. Viruses also spread through shared media, such as Universal Serial Bus (USB) drives.



Symptoms that we can notice with an infected computer:

- a. Slows down
- b. Runs short of memory
- c. Files can be corrupted or deleted
- d. Computer shut down intermediately

In order to remove viruses, we need to take actions:

- i. Install regularly updated anti viruses
- ii. Do not buy pirated versions of software, buy originals
- iii. On internet, visit secured sites

Adware

Adware is a software program that display advertisements on your computer. Adware is usually distributed with download software. Most often, adware is displayed in a popup window. Adware popup windows are sometimes difficult to control; they open new windows faster than users can close them. Adware and spyware are usually installed on a computer without the user's knowledge. These programs collect information stored on the computer, change the computer configuration or open extra windows on the computer without the user's content.

Malware

Malware is a file or program other than a virus that is potentially harmful. Many malware attacks are phishing attacks, which try to persuade the user to unknowingly give attackers access to personal information. As you fill out an online form, the data is sent to the attacker. Malware can be removed using spyware and adware removal tools.
