- 5. You speak very quickly. Adverbs of degree are located in front of the word that they modify. Adverbs of manner are found after the direct object of the sentence or if there is no object, after the verb.
- 6. She never eats vegetables. Adverbs of frequency are located in front of the verb, unless the verb is "to be", in which case the adverb is located after the verb.
- 7. They are always late to class. Adverbs of frequency are located in front of the verb, unless the verb is "to be", in which case the adverb is located after the verb.
- 8. I am still waiting. "Still" is located in front of the verb except when the verb is "to be", in which case "still" is found after the verb.
- 9. is he there yet?

"Yet" always goes at the end of the sentence.

10. She always goes swimming on Saturdays.

Adverbs of frequency are located in front of the verb, unless the verb is "to be", in which case the adverb is located after the verb.
